


Our school was originally established by a group of parents in the early 1970s in response to the closure of its forerunner, Woolton Hall Preparatory School.

Since opening in 1975 at Lyndhurst Road, Mossley Hill in Liverpool, we have gone from strength to strength, faithful to our traditions and founding values.





Carleton House re-located to our beautiful home on Menlove Avenue, Calderstones in Autumn 2009 marking an important step in the school's development and reinforcing our reputation as Merseyside's leading co-ed preparatory school for the 21st century.

With our consistent outstanding academic results and excellent provison for our pupils, we remain a popular choice for families in the Liverpool area, as evidenced by our over subscribed classes and waiting lists.





THREE STAGES, ONE FAMILY







Carleton House School is divided into three Key Stages, but our approach and philosophy is holistic throughout the school. Our focus is child-centred, with small class sizes ensuring that we are able to give every child the attention and support they need to realise their educational and personal potential.

The school has three stages, starting with the Early Years Foundation Stage comprising:

- Nursery (age 3-4)
- Reception (age 4-5)

Our Key Stage One comprises of two classes (Year 1 and Year 2) catering for children aged five to seven. Children progress to Key Stage Two, which has four classes (Years 3-6) for the seven to eleven age range.

Small class sizes with a maximum of 23 pupils mean pupils benefit from more individual attention - especially important when preparing for entrance exams for secondary school.

After school club is available up to 6pm for nursery children which can be booked via our online booking system.

As part of our Catholic School ethos and to develop children's moral and social perspective, we give a high priority to working with charities and supporting community projects and initiatives.



OUR CURRICULUM

DEVELOPING THE WHOLE CHILD

Carleton House offers the full statutory primary curriculum. Pupils are prepared for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 SATs tests.

Pupils' attainment at the end of both of these Key Stages is consistently well above the expected level of attainment nationally.

With small class sizes, highly experienced class teachers, ably supported by a dedicated teaching assistant in every class, we ensure all children are supported to reach their full potential.

We employ specialist teachers of Spanish, Physical Education and Computing to ensure our children are provided with an exciting and engaging curriculum taught by specialists.





CURRICULUM TRIPS AND VISITORS

Visitors to school include Theatre Companies providing Shakespeare performances or Christmas pantomimes, Circus skills workshops for our younger children and dance work shops linked to world book day. All trips and visits are inclusive of school fees.

All classes are provided with exciting trips and visitors linked to the curriculum to enhance, support and consolidate their learning.

These range from day trips to Chester Zoo, the Liverpool Museums, Liverpool Philharmonic Concert Hall and Manchester Science Museum to name but a few.

RESIDENTIAL TRIPS

Our children benefit from the exciting experience of residential trips starting in Year 3. These immersive experiences take our children out of their comfort zones and immerse them in nature, where they face challenges, develop resilience, and acquire vital life skills.

During these adventures, children learn to work together, communicate effectively, and solve problems in unfamiliar settings, fostering leadership and teamwork capabilities.



YEAR 3

Our Year 3 children spend their first one night residential with us at The Anderton Centre in Chorley. The site is spread across 4 acres of woodland and has exclusive use of Lower Rivington Reservoir. The children enjoy activities include canoeing, low ropes, abseiling and bush craft.



YEAR 4

Our Year 4 children enjoy a two night stay at Manor Adventure in Shropshire.
Culmington Manor offers exceptional facilities within a 100 acre estate in an area of outstanding natural beauty in the South Shropshire countryside. Children enjoy activities including abseiling, low ropes, fencing and crate stacking.





YEAR 5

Our Year 5 children spend two nights away from home at Manor Adventure Willersley castle. The estate offers exceptional facilities within a 65 acre estate on the edge of the Peak District. The children take part in activities including obstacle course, blind trail, fencing and Jacob's ladder.





YEAR 6

Our Year 6 children spend 4 nights at Manor Adventure Lockerbie in Scotland. Lockerbie Manor is set amidst 78 acres of tranquil woodland and fields inhabited with an abundance of natural wildlife. The children take part in a wide range of activities including kayaking, climbing wall, archery and zip wire.

OPPORTUNITIES





In Carleton House all pupils are given the opportunity to fully develop their musical talents.

Our specialist curriculum music teacher provides

lessons across the school from Nursery to Year 6. Children are taught to sing, to create and compose music, to perform and to listen to and evaluate music. They are given the opportunity and confidence to become musicians.

Our strong ongoing partnership with outside music company Pulse,







has ensured all pupils in Key Stage 2 are given the opportunity learn a musical instrument, taught weekly by experienced music teachers. Our children progress to grade exams and take part in Christmas and summer concerts for our families. Many of our children go on to achieve music scholarships at local secondary schools of their choice.

Every child is a star ready to shine

Music, creativity and performance are an important part of helping raise our children's confidence and an integral part of our school life. From our termly class assemblies, to our annual Christmas nativities, our children are aiven varied develop opportunities to their confidence and public performance skills.







Each Year our Key Stage 2 pupils are prepared for and take part in our superb annual end of year school play. Our debating club, competitive public speaking opportunities and speech choir all help to develop the skills of our young people, helping them grow in confidence throughout their time with us at Carleton House.

Our exceptionally talented choir are invited to perform at a range of different festivals and events throughout the school year, the highlight being a Christmas performance at the Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral.

Each year our Year 6 pupils enter the ESB "English Speaking Board" exam. The children are carefully prepared by expert teachers to develop their public speaking skills; as they prepare to speak about a topic of personal interest, read from a favourite novel and recite a poem by heart. These skills stay with them well beyond their years with us at Carleton.



SPORTING OPPORTUNITIES

Developing heathly habits for life

Sport helps children to remain healthy, develop leadership skills and understand the value of teamwork and co-operation.

We have a dedicated specialist PE teacher who teaches lessons from Nursery to Year 6. Key Stage 2 have swimming lessons under the supervision of fully qualified swimming teachers and coaches.

We believe in developing a competitive sporting spirit with an emphasis on participation. A wide variety of games are played in the school and at inter-school level including football, cricket, netball, rounders, swimming, athletics and cross-country.

We are members of LSSP, Liverpool Schools Sports Partnership which allows us to compete against other local schools. We also take part in school football leagues and competitions with other local independent schools.

We are lucky enough to have access to an excellent range of neighbouring facilities, including Volair pool and Wavertree athletics track. The nearby Calderstones Park is also used for cross country training and football sessions.

TRANSITION TO SECONDARY SCHOOL



MOVING ON



At Carleton House, we are dedicated to providing a comprehensive and well-rounded curriculum that prepares our pupils with the skills and confidence they need for the exciting transition to the next phase of their educational journey.

Our experienced teaching staff are experts in guiding our children through the preparation for entrance exams. We are well-versed in the specific requirements of school entrance exams, including timed extended writing assessments and advanced comprehension skills. In the junior classes, our students receive instruction in both verbal and non-verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, and spatial awareness. Test-taking techniques and time management are ongoing areas of emphasis.

In the Year 5 summer term, our students participate in weekly practice tests conducted under simulated exam conditions. In the Year 6 autumn term, we offer additional optional exam preparation classes on Saturday mornings, ensuring that they are fully prepared for their exams. To further mirror the exam experience, we organise an off site mock exam in a local church hall at the end of September.

To promote emotional well-being, we incorporate mindfulness and breathing techniques into our curriculum. Additionally, we provide one-on-one meetings with parents to address their concerns and provide support.

We maintain strong connections with local independent secondary schools and offer tailored exam practice and interview preparation sessions for students seeking admission. We also provide reference letters upon request to support applications for bursaries.

MUSICAL APTITUDE

For musically gifted students, our robust music curriculum is designed to nurture their talents. We have a successful track record of students receiving offers for music placements at their chosen secondary schools. Throughout Key Stage 2, we offer extracurricular music theory lessons, including opportunities to sit for ABRSM Music Theory Grade exams.


In the Year 5 summer term and Year 6 autumn term, we provide optional Musical Aptitude lessons for students interested in applying for music placements at select secondary schools.



ENTRY AND FEES

Carleton House Preparatory School is an independent fee-paying school.

We endeavour to keep fees as competitive and affordable as possible to ensure that we continue to offer value for money whilst maintaining the school's exceptional standard of education and pastoral care and reputation as one of the best private preparatory schools in the North West.

We are regularly oversubscribed with places being allocated in accordance with our admissions policy, which is available to view on our website.

PAYMENT OF FEES

Fees are payable in advance in full, in advance by 3 termly instalments or in advance by 10 monthly instalments (August to May inclusive).

School Fees for Academic Year 2024/25

Nursery to Year 6

Tuition Fees: £10,290.00 per year (Inclusive of insurance and school meals but excluding VAT.) We do not accept the Government Tax Free Childcare or Childcare Vouchers for payment towards school fees (Reception to Year 6).

Nursery Fees

The School accepts the 15/30 government funded childcare grant for Nursery. Please check with Liverpool City Council for eligibility criteria and how to access funding.

Early Years funding will be deducted from school fees as outlined above at the relevant rate as paid by Liverpool City Council.

The School accepts Government Tax Free Childcare and all Childcare Vouchers as payment towards Nursery fees.

After School Club

The school operates an after school club from 3.30pm to 6pm daily.

Sessions can be booked on a regular or ad hoc basis (Dependent upon availability).

A half or a full session can be booked via our school booking site. Payment is required at the point of booking.

A snack is provided for children staying beyond 4.30pm.
